

Newsmax Agrees to \$67 Million Settlement in Dominion Defamation Case, Citing Unfair Trial



Newsmax Media has reached a **\$67 million settlement** with Dominion Voting Systems, resolving a high-profile defamation lawsuit originally seeking **\$1.6 billion**. The dispute centered on Newsmax's broadcast claims that Dominion's voting machines manipulated the 2020 U.S. presidential election results.[ReutersPolitico](#)

Settlement Terms and Timing

Newsmax will pay the settlement in **three installments**:

- **\$27 million**—already paid upon agreement
- **\$20 million** due in January 2026
- Another **\$20 million** due in January 2027

Newsmax Statement and Market Reaction

Although the case will not proceed to trial, Newsmax maintains that its election coverage was fair and balanced. The company criticized the presiding judge in Delaware for bias, arguing it was denied a fair opportunity to defend itself.[X \(formerly Twitter\)+14Reuters+14The Guardian+14](#)
